## DISCUSSING THEATER IN COLLEGE CLASSROOMS -ONLINE!

On Stage: Creating a Community Dialogue Around Live Theater is a theater outreach program fiscally





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


sponsored through <u>Springboard for the Arts</u>, with the goal of enhancing in-class learning, and building the next generation of theater audiences by making local theater relevant to current events, personal values and narratives.

Traveling to academic classes, On Stage has brought local actors to read scenes from plays in current local production to a variety of classes and disciplines. But since Covid-19 hit in March, we had to pivot and launch a new education experience for students. This new online

program, <u>OnStage/OnLine</u>, is a series of discussions based on plays that are 'in the works' to





These past two weeks, OnStage/OnLine led discussions with over 200 students in twelve college classrooms around the Twin Cities to discuss Bertolt Brecht's play, *The Resistible Rise of Arturo Ui*. When an economic slump provides prime conditions for the rise of a small-time thug (strikingly similar to Al Capone) to take over the vegetable trade in 1930's Chicago, a parallel is set up for the story of another thug who is rising to power on the world stage in 1941, Adolf Hitler. The Resistible Rise of Arturo Ui is a viciously funny "parable play," written but rarely performed in the United States. With the 2020 presidential election **ONE WEEK AWAY**, Ui shows a striking similarity to Trump's rise to power with his use of threats, blackmail, lack of empathy, and bribes of protection. <u>Frank Theatre</u> last produced the play in 2001. Local theater educators (Wendy Knox, Maria Asp, Ansa Akyea, Sun Mee Chomet and Patrick Bailey) facilitated the discussions. Below you can see the classes where discussions were held.











# SURVEY RESULTS

Of the students we visited, 87% had seen a play before, but no student had ever seen a Frank Theatre play.

When asked "when would you feel comfortable going to see a play", 40% answered "Not quite yet... but soon and when it feels safe" 27% answered "Now... but if it was socially distant AND masks were required" 18% answered "NOW"

14% answered "Not until there is a vaccine"

98% of students said that the discussion added to their fuller understanding to what they have been discussing in class.

96% of students said that as a result of the discussion, they are more inclined to see this play when it is presented at a theater.

98% of students said that after participating in the discussion, they are more inclined to see OTHER live theater productions.
